CHRISTIANS ARE – PEOPLE OF LENT

On Ash Wednesday, March 9th, you may be able to pick fellow Christians out of a crowd by the cross of ashes still on their foreheads after attending church services. But once the ashes are washed away, how can you recognize the People of Lent? And is there something you have in common with other Christian people observing Lent in our town or around the world?

The Church has a long tradition of Lent as a season of *prayer*, *fasting and almsgiving*. Each of these exercises is a spiritual discipline/preparation for Easter within the Bible's familiar time frame of 40 days; echoing a familiar pattern in Scripture. Remember the Israelites spent 40 years as nomads, a nation-intraining in the desert, before they were allowed to settle in the Promised Land. Generations later, Jesus spent 40 days in the desert in training before taking up His public ministry of preaching, teaching, and healing.

For Christians the world over, the weeks of this season have always been a time for **re**training, for coming into a right relationship with God; as the wondrous events of Holy Week approached. But how do people of Lent do this training?

Giving up... During past centuries Christians have tried to fast, giving up meat, candy, smoking, or liquor during Lent, for example. This sort of self-denial led some to a deeper experience of God's presence in their lives.

... or Just giving ... Instead of giving up something during Lent, more and more Christians today

are emphasizing *giving* through special acts of love and charity. Such activity can be another form of self -denial and may include donating time or food or clothing to people in need. *Giving*, too, can lead to a renewed sense of God's purpose in our lives.

Those 40 days Jesus spent "in training" brought Him to a sense of His Father's will for His life. He knew from that moment His mission was to give His life for you and me on the cross for the forgiveness of our sins. He would be the sacrificial lamb "take away the sins of the world."

Our preparation this Lent – whether *giving up* or *giving*, whether taking part in special worship or extra prayer or Bible studies – can free us to find our mission in life, too. Whether it be on a large or small scale whether it is a surprise or quite familiar, our mission is a gift, paid for by our Savior and delivered to us through our baptism into the Christian community, the People of Lent.

LENTEN WORDS

LENT – The season observed since 200 A.D. running from Ash Wednesday to Holy Week, named for the season when the days begin to lengthen.

Paschal – A word taken from "pascha" for the Jewish festival of Passover: (1) in a larger sense refers to Jesus as the paschal Lamb sacrificed for the sins of the world; (2) refers to the period of the Church Year from Ash Wednesday to Pentecost. The paschal season reminds us of our own pass-over and exodus from death to life through baptism.

40 Days – The length of Jesus' "desert period" when He determined to live His life His Father's way, in spite of Satan's tempting offers. As early Christian converts spent weeks preparing for their life-changing baptism on Easter Eve, so Christians today observe Lent for 40 days.

Ash Wednesday – This day, traced back to 600 A.D. marked the start of the Christian Lenten season. Many worshipers receive a cross of ashes on the forehead as a sign of humility and repentance on this day.

Holy Week – The days immediately concluding the season of Lent, leading to Easter Day. The focus is upon Jesus' last week on earth from Palm Sunday to the day of His crucifixion and burial.



CHUCK CAME TO US BY WAY OF NEBRAS-KA, AFTER HE MARRIED HIS HIGH SCHOOL SWEETHEART, ANN HARP, (BOTH OF WHOM ARE ORIGINALLY FROM MICHIGAN) IN OUR CHURCH ON MARCH 14, 2009. THEIRS IS A UNIQUE STORY OF A FRIENDSHIP OVER A 58 YEAR PERIOD OF TIME. ANY ONE WHO IS INTERESTED, MAY ASK THEM ABOUT IT AND I'M CERTAIN ANN WILL BE GLAD TO TELL YOU THE STORY.
