CHRISTIANS ARE – PEOPLE OF THE PASSION

Christians are people of the Passion – not romantic passion, but passion in the special sense of the suffering of Christ Jesus our Lord.

Unpopular as suffering is, during "Holy Week" Christians immerse themselves in the story of our Lord's Passion – the suffering and death that led to our redemption and hope for eternal life through Jesus' resurrection. Unfortunately, some think that the suffering described in Holy Week makes Christianity a religion of blood – with a morbid preoccupation with guilt beside.

Surely the events of 33 A.D. were brutal. But Holy Week, like all of Lent, is our preparation for a victory celebration. Palm Sunday is a dress rehearsal for Easter so to speak. Maundy Thursday is our thanksgiving for receiving the gift of the Lord's Supper and a lesson in sacrifice. And Good Friday encourages us through the sheer power of Jesus' love for humankind and His unshakable trust in His Father in the face of apparent defeat.

Below is some information and some thoughts on The Days of Holy Week, so that we may have a renewed sense of appreciation for what took place; rather than treating the days as some rout ritual we do just to be doing.

Palm Sunday or Passion Sunday – the first day of Holy Week – joins celebration with sorrow, victory with defeat. Jesus' entry into Jerusalem on a donkey, surrounded by well-wishers and cheering children, sounds impressive. But after this scene comes the Scripture reading of Jesus' arrest and punishment at the hands of the authorities. Yet, as people of the Passion, we don't mourn. We celebrate our Lord, who has chosen to endure suffering in order to win the ultimate battle. When churches reenact that glorious day it is not just an imitations of Jesus' brief ride. They are our celebrations of His Lordship today and our faith in His eventual victory tomorrow over all

evil and death.

Our observance of the next events in Holy Week happens within a continuous 48-hour period, involving three days – Maundy Thursday evening, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday.

Maundy Thursday evening offers Christians the opportunity to celebrate the Lord's Supper on the eve of its institution. Some churches like ours first sponsor a seder-like meal, such as Jesus would have eaten. But the communion meal of bread and the cup that follows on this night is no imitation. It is really our Master's gift of Himself to each of us as we remember Him – prepared to sacrifice Himself for our sake. On this night, many churches also follow Jesus' humble example of washing each other's feet. Behind these observances stand Jesus' words of this evening – His new mandate: "As I have loved you, so you must also love one another" (John 13:34).

Good Friday is observed by Christians in two ways. First, a service beginning at noon for meditations on Jesus' seven last words from the cross or emphasis regarding the crucifixion itself. Second, by a service in the shadows of evening (Tenebrae), focusing on the crucifixion and death of our Lord.

Holy Saturday and Easter may be a time for many of us to be with relatives. As people of the Passion, however, the excitement of these days also involves the final outcome of our Lord's Passion during these three days.

Following ancient tradition, Easter services in some churches begin with an Easter Vigil on Saturday evening. Here Christians read the Scripture stories describing God's long relationship with His chosen people from creation to the resurrection of His Son. Candles light the darkness and the first Easter hymns of the season are sung. Other churches wait until sunrise or later Sunday morning for their first festive Easter services, announcing the resurrection of our Lord in triumphant festival worship.

Actually, Easter is not just a day. It is also a season of 50 days from Easter Sunday to Pentecost Sunday, just as Lent is a season of 40 days.

Day-to-day living calls us to continue as people of the Passion, people who struggle and even suffer because the way we have chosen to live is often in opposition to so much of our world – its greed and violence, its exclusion and oppression, its wastefulness and abuse of nature and fellow humans. We know that our Lord's way is right and that His way leads to our goal of redemption and resurrection. Therefore, we dare to act as though God's way is the new order of things, believing that the way of Jesus and the way of the people of the Passion is the way of victory. Jesus said, "In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world" (John 16:33).
