#### **PRAYER IN AMERICA**

#### ("National Day of Prayer" - May 5, 2011)

Prayer is an important part of America's history, reflecting the faith of our founding fathers. Civic prayers and national days of prayer have long been cornerstones of our constitutional republic (and are a vital aspect of our future, as well!). In fact, America's first national call to prayer predates the *United States Constitution*.

In 1776 the Continental Congress called for a day of prayer. The members believed that "by sincere repentance and amendment of life" they might "appease God's righteous displeasure, and through the merits and mediation of Jesus Christ, obtain His pardon and forgiveness." Their expression of humility and dependence on God provided a bedrock of faith on which the United States was founded and still operates today. And needed now more so than ever!

In his proclamation for a day of "humiliation, fasting and prayer" in 1863, President Abraham Lincoln wrote the following:

> "It is the duty of nations, as well as of men, to owe their dependence upon the overruling power of God, to confess their sins and transgressions in humble sorrow, yet with assured hope that genuine repentance will lead to mercy and pardon; and to recognize the sublime truth, announced in the Holy Scriptures and proven by all history, that those nations only are blessed whose God is the Lord . . ."

Lincoln's personal prayer life had a profound influence on this period of our nation's history. The year 1863 was crucial: the Civil War had already raged for two years, and the Emancipation Proclamation, declaring an end to slavery in the nation, had gone into effect in January. In early July, the Battle of Gettysburg began. The stakes were high, and both sides knew that

the outcome of the battle could well determine the outcome of the war. This event and others like it pointed future American leaders to the Lord – not as a last resort, but as a first response.

That lesson was not wasted on President George W. Bush. After the deadly terrorist attacks on New York, Washington, D.C. and Pennsylvania on September 11, 2001, the president responded by calling the nation to its knees. Thousands were dead and missing following the worst attack on American soil in our nation's history. But in the midst of the tragedy, the commander in chief pointed Americans toward Divine solace when he said, "Prayer has comforted us in sorrow, and will help strengthen us for the journey ahead."

Just three days after the terrorist attacks, Bush led the country in a National Day of Prayer and Remembrance. During a brief speech inside the National Cathedral, he noted, "As we have been assured, neither death nor life, nor angels nor principalities nor powers, nor things present nor things to come, nor height nor depth, can separate us from God's love. May He bless the souls of the departed. May He comfort our own. And, may He always guide our country."

The Lord calls us to intercessory prayer on behalf of our nation and its leaders, and we are privileged to have the first Thursday of every May set aside for that very purpose. Our church sanctuary will be open during regular business hours, if you would like to come and pray. Resources will also be available for you to use during your prayer time. As we endeavor to be "salt and light" in our communities, let us seize the opportunity afforded us by our government and join together in prayer as "One nation under God."
