From the Pastor's Desk

I frequently listen to the Joy FM radio station. They just held a half marathon (13.1 miles) fund raiser to help raise awareness concerning the problem of human trafficking for the sex trade in Florida. LGUMW are sponsoring a seminar on that same topic Saturday, March 3rd. The Joy FM event exceeded the expectations of the station and they were talking about how so many different people came together to help them reach the goal. It occurred to me that people were doing whatever was necessary - cooking, passing our water, registering runners, decorating places, arranging sponsors, providing transportation or lodging – whether that was their area of expertise or not. They were many different denominations involved in this event from many different churches; there was probably even some non-Christians in the event just because the issue is near and dear to them.

I began thinking about the church and how wonderful it would be if the local church could pull together the way people did for the Joy FM event. The local church could accomplish much if it would ever catch on to the fact that they have a purpose in life; to bring God glory and tell others about the Gospel. Unfortunately many in our society today think that the church exists only for them and their needs. Many people have what is being called a "consumer attitude" toward church. "Consumer attitude" means you look for the church that best gives you what you want — the music you like, the flavor of coffee you prefer, the teaching style you are most comfortable with; and

if they don't you go find one that does; but is that really being the church? The Apostle Paul made it pretty plain in his letter to the Corinthians that the church was a body made up of many different parts with Jesus being the head.

In today's society we think that salvation is for the individual – it saves a single person's soul and that is all it does. While it is true salvation save a soul what we forget is that once that person is saved they are then part of the church and they are to help the church reach others for Jesus Christ. In other words we are saved in order to reach out to others - therefore salvation while it greatly affects an individual it is to enhance and help the community. The early church understood this; why don't we? Or as I have heard some church leaders say concerning church members -"It's not about you it's about others". If we really believe this we will realize the goal of reaching others for Christ is more important than what we like or dislike. It also means every time something doesn't go our way we don't pout and go home mad but we pull together understanding the importance of saving souls and getting them involved in this war that is being waged for the souls of mankind. Stan Koyama was born and raised in San Francisco, where he began organ lessons at the age of seven, and through high school, he continued organ and music studies with Hal Shutz of South San Francisco. He graduated from San Francisco State university with a Bachelor of music. He has performed pop organ concerts and conducted organ clinics all over the continental US, Honolulu and Alaska, Since 1996, he has performed concerts and conducted clinics in England, Wales and Europe.



In England, Stan was named "International organist Extraordinaire" by Organ Keyboard Magazine.

In 1980, Stan won the Grand Prize at the Yamaha National Electone Festival and went on to compete at the Yamaha International Electone Festival in Tokyo. He moved to South Tampa in 2004, and In 2005 Stan was hired by Central Music in Clearwater, Fl, where he teaches classes, seminars and private organ lessons and has students from around the world.

International students have come to Florida to take lessons from Stan and Several of his organ students have won scholarships and prizes. One of them also competed at the Yamaha international Electone festival in Tokyo.
