From the Pastor's Desk

Ezek. 36:26 A new heart I will give you, and a new spirit I will put within you; and I will remove from your body the heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh.

We are creatures of comfort, aren't we? We have air conditioning in our homes and automobiles to keep us cool in hot weather and some of us have pools to cool us off. Many of the complaints dealing with churches have to do with the temperature of the buildings. If something causes us to get out of our comfort zone we complain. When the seat belt law was first passed there were many complaints because it was uncomfortable to have that belt across your chest. Yeah, we like things the way we want them and do not want to change. But God demands that we change; He demands we get a new heart and a new spirit – a heart and spirit like His.

I'm not sure if you know it but receiving a new heart is not comfortable; not only is your chest split open but there is much pain and discomfort as you recuperate from the surgical procedure. There is a rehab and exercise routine, the change of life-style and diet and the anti-rejection medicines to be taken for life. Nope, it is not comfortable but it is desirable compared to the alternative of death; isn't it? Of course

Church Council Meeting Minutes -----May 6, 2012

Meeting Opening-Chair, Mike Stafford, opened our meeting at 12:15 with a prayer and an article about Japan's future and how US has not followed the same path to some extent because of our churches. Our ministries do matter.

Mike had February minutes and a May calendar for us. Rosanne Stafford moved, Carol Troup 2nd, APPROVED.

Finance-Wayne Wesley-working on current 2012 property and liability of \$13,000+, paid ½ so far and will be paid hopefully in June.

Trustees-Tom Burns-inventory has been made current. We've had surveys done for electricity usage and property size concerning insurance. We have $23\pm$ air conditioners, all older and not energy efficient. Small classroom in FLC will be turned into a records room.

SPPR-Carol Davis-we will have Pastor Steve for another year. They are working on a Personal Policy and job descriptions, and making sure that credentials are up to date for child/youth protection policy. SPPR and Finance are considering switching Monday meeting times-this switch would help expedite decisions being made and brought to Church Council.

Caring and Sharing-Ann Fox, they will be tweaking the lists to try and build encouragement within the group.

Youth-Lee Mueller, Odd Jobs are funding youth accounts, camp scholarships, mission trips, and slush fund. 8 campers going to Leesburg this year, 5 who have never been. We've been delivering meals on Wednesday night to those who have been ill or in hospital. Planning summer activities tonight.

HONOR-Sandy Standiford-HONOR is alive and kicking working throughout Polk County to help our elderly who are in need.

UMW-JoAnn Mickle, thanks for all your donations to the rummage sale—about \$2700 was raised.

From the Board of Trustees ...

We would like to thank Brad Fox for the excellent job he has done for many years keeping the Air Condition units running at a very low cost.

Unfortunately the years are catching up to us, during our inventory it has been discovered that 3 of them are 12 years old, 11 the manufactures date can not be read and the rest are 23 years old.

The Trustees are gathering information about replacing them, and possibly replacing or rearranging and cleaning the duct work.

We will accept any suggestions or help from anyone, thank you.

FROM THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Report by George Band's son, who is an Air Conditioner Engineer.

Sanctuary - 4, 12 year old units still working good. Would be more efficient with new units, improvements could be ceiling fans for better air flow.

Pre School - 3 units 20 plus years old - need to be replaced. Ceilings fans would increase air flow. Duct work needs to be inspected and possibly needs to be replaced or rerouted.

Office - 1 unit 12 year's old - ok for a while.

FLC - Big problems, 20 units, 23 years old, and poorly designed, Need an engineer to tell us what kind of system to put in.

Report by Lakeland Electric.

Sanctuary - replace all lights with spiral florescent, would save on electric and air conditioning, because the 10 lights in the sanctuary put out over 250 degrees of heat each. Ceiling fans and more insulation would also help.

Pre School - replace AC units as soon as possible, replace lights with florescent, add more insulation and digital/programmable thermostats.

FLC - Replace AC units and 82 gallon hot water heater with a 30 gallon or smaller. Also more modem stove, freezer, more insulation and digital/programmable thermostats. FLC is the biggest problem money wise, from Oct 09 to Mar 2012 the lowest bill was \$559.39 and the highest was \$1,185.41. Average is \$855.92. The reason for this is because this bldg is on the demand program. We need to reduce usage by at least 50 KW.

Lakeland Electric offers a rebate on replacing light bulbs - they will rebate Y2 up to \$1,000.00 per account. They also have a program fot replacing AC units, and a service rebate that would cover the office.

As we get more information, we will keep you informed.





School will be out this month and it will be time for the summer program again at the Children's Home. We will again be collecting items to take up to the Children's Home the kids can use during the summer. We have a box in the Narthex for any donations.
