We can't thank you enough for your support to help make camp a reality for 10 of our youth!

We would like to share some of our camp experiences with you. Shortly after leaving camp we answered questions about camp. Below is an excerpt of those answers.

What is your most striking memory from camp? Watching God work through the kids during praise and worship times, getting to know each other through small groups and skills, adding to the "heart" during worship, meeting new friends, learning how to further my walk with God through Chapel, gaining faith in myself and having friends encourage me during the "leap of faith" challenge, my relationship with my counselor, making friends during skills, small group time on the dock, knowing that I helped change lives, and seeing all the students support each other throughout the week.

Other comments? It was nice to be away from electronic noise, more time on ropes course, and I can't wait to go next year, same week,.
