From the Pastor's Desk

I sit in front of my computer in the office asking God, "What should I write about for this edition of the newsletter?" I have been asking for several days now and I hear nothing... but then... I hear the sound of the office door opening, I hear the rustle of bags as food is distributed, I hear voices saying things like, "Thank you. I did not know if my kids and I would eat tonight." "Thank you, you have given me hope." "Thank you for being here."

The relief you can hear in the voices and the smiles on their faces say more than the words. I think, this is the church being the church; this is the people of God feeding others as Jesus did with the crowds. This is giving to those in need. This is what disciples of Christ are to be about, sharing God's love with others.

There are restrictions on who can receive food (you need to live in our area), but no requirement that you attend one of our services. Some have argued there should be, yet Jesus did not limit himself when he came to earth. He fed those who were there at the time, whether they supported him or not. This is not the only need in our society or community today, but it is one that God is using Lake Gibson UMC to meet. Thank you for all your donations of food and money; thank you for supporting this mission of LGUMC. Thank you to those volunteers that work so tirelessly to prepare the food bags, who make sure we have the variety of foods needed, and to those who pick up the day-old bread from Publix and deliver it to our church. YOU MAKE A DIFFERENCE. This mission is not just about one person, but there are many involved. This mission shows us that the church can and does make a difference in the world.

The giving of food to someone in need prayerfully plants a seed in that person – a seed that says God loves you and so do we here at Lake Gibson UMC; a seed that says don't give up, God has a plan for you; a seed that says someone cares about you. We are called to plant the seed. This is the message Jesus brings the world from God. We are not alone, God is here with us, among us and God wants to be in relationship with us.

Mission is basically the church and followers of Christ showing others the love of God in their actions. Mission is going into the world and sharing God's love with others. The food pantry is loving your neighbor as yourself, and perhaps even loving your enemy in some cases. Do you contribute to the spreading of the Gospel in some way, through some mission?

What other things could we accomplish if we would band together? How many people could and would feel the love of God if we quit arguing about what to do or how to do something, and actually **did** something? The food pantry is not perfect; there are those who use and abuse the system; there are those who refuse to support it with donations or work, yet it helps people. There is no perfect mission, perfect church, or perfect pastor, but the Apostle Peter says:

Above all, love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude of sins. 1 Peter 4:8 (NIV)

Maybe we should focus on sharing the love of God and allow that love to cover up our imperfections.

Commission on a Way Forward Report

Over the past few years, there has been discussion on how United Methodists across the globe might deal with human sexuality. The Bishops of the United Methodist Church appointed a Commission to see how varying approaches would impact the denomination.

The Commission has now prepared a report which will be provided to the Special Session of the General Conference scheduled for February 23 - 26, 2019. While there is a recommendation (The One Church Plan) and at least two alternative proposals which were studied by the Commission (The Connectional Conference Plan and The Traditionalist Plan) which were developed outside of the Commission, more will likely follow as delegates offer counterproposals.

So that you understand the difficulties in coming up with a Book of Discipline which supports everyone's desires, it would be helpful to actually read the current report. I encourage all to read the document so that we might have an informed discussion. You can access it at the web site below:

A brief summary of each of the three plans mentioned above is provided below from the UMC web site (umc.org):

The One Church Plan, endorsed by the Council of Bishops, would allow, but not require, United Methodist clergy to perform same-gender weddings where legal, and allow, but not require, annual conferences to ordain LGBTQ pastors. "The One Church Plan is built on the belief that it is possible to live with more space while we focus on our common mission," the report states.

The Connectional Conference Plan would create "three values-based connectional conferences" in the U.S., and provide for central conferences to align with one of those connectional conferences or become one of their own. According to the report, the "Connectional Conference Plan addresses the reality of the UMC as it is now."

The Traditionalist Plan is mentioned in the report, but details written by "a few members of the Council of Bishops" appear in appendix 3. "The Traditional Model maintains our global United Methodist teaching on human sexuality," the plan states.

This was a 5th Sunday with a special collection for the Florida United Methodist Children's Home and a coin collection by the members of our Children's Ministry. Two Services Return on October 7th!

On Laity Sunday we celebrate that we are called, laity as well as clergy, to go and make disciples in a world so desperately in need of hope through our humble service. Jesus modeled the process for us in Mark 10:45 . . . Therefore, GO!

Discipleship Ministries of the United Methodist Church states that the core process of every local congregation is to **offer H.O.P.E. to the community it serves**. The *Book of Discipline of the United Methodist Church*, paragraph 122, provides a model for a discipleship system that includes proclaiming, seeking, welcoming, leading persons to commit their lives to God; nurturing people in Christian living; and sending people into the world to live lovingly and justly as servants of Christ.

What is H.O.P.E.?

H = Hospitality: Reaching out and receiving new people

O = Offering Christ: Offering opportunities to make a commitment to Christ

P = Purpose: Growing in faith through participation in the means of grace

E = Engagement: Helping transform the surrounding community.

Rev. Dr. Candace Lewis, Gulf Central District Superintendent, has called for regional charge conferences this year. Quoting from her September GCD newsletter:

"As we prepare for our fall 2018 Charge Conference season our Theme is **Equipping the Church for Resilience**, **Innovation and Growth**. This year we will have Regional Charge Conferences - gathering 12 – 14 churches together for a time of worship, fellowship and a discussion of important church business matters. As we focus on the importance of equipping the church, I'm experiencing equipping as evaluating what's growing and pruning away what's not. I believe our churches can flourish and be in vital mission and ministry in communities throughout the Gulf Central District."

In this first of several regional GCD charge conferences, Lake Gibson will be reviewed along with 13 other churches. The Lakeland churches are College Heights, Crystal Lake, First, Highlands, Kathleen, Shepherd's Community, St. Mark, Trinity, and Temple. The other four churches are Mulberry and Bartow's Alturas, Asbury and First. As you can see, this is a very disparate group.

It would be good if members of Lake Gibson's congregation attended this review to support Pastor Steve and our church.

Food Pantry Report

During the summer months of June, July and August we provided 241 bags of groceries and 263 bags of Publix baked goods to hungry families, with a weekly average of 18 bags of groceries and 20 bags of baked goods. So far this year we have given out 509 bags of groceries and 574 bags of baked goods.

Thank you to everyone who makes our food pantry possible, starting with the Lake Gibson members and constituents who contribute canned and dry goods; the people who put away the items in the office and in the small freezer; those who fill the paper grocery bags [usually Marina] and especially to Yvonne and Todd Bower who buy the hamburger (and other items if we run short).

Thanks to the friendly volunteers who greet the people, give out the bags and help carry them to the cars every Thursday. Thanks to the individuals who donate money, as well as to the UMW and the Sunday School classes for their contributions, and thanks to some of the winners of the Love in Action drawings who have given their envelopes (plus a little more) to the food pantry.

A BIG thank you to the Publix bakery at Lake Gibson Shopping Center, 6767 US Highway 98 North.

Finally, thanks to the people who pick up the Publix bakery items Sunday and Wednesday evenings, mark out the prices and deliver them to the office and FLC: Michael and Sharon Moake, Debbie Moore, Sandy Stanfield, Fred Fredrickson and family (Holly and Deborah).

Ours is a small food pantry, but it means so much to people who have very little -- we are touching lives of the needy in our community with this mission.

Financial Update

It was most interesting to receive an annotated apportionment bill from the District Office informing us that we were 11% behind where we were last year at this time. As you can see from the figures below, we have paid out more in five of the eight months than we received. We still intend to pay all apportionments by the end of the year. But, we do have some other pressing needs.


Electronic Sign

As you are aware, one of the four Campus Revitalization projects we started in 2015 - 2016 was to place an electronic sign somewhere on campus. Our current sign board is in front of the sanctuary, between our access road and the sanctuary. We considered placing the sign board closer to W. Daughtery Road and moving our access road closer to the sanctuary. Unfortunately, it was determined that the curvature of West Daughtery Road at this point hinders the reading of our current sign board. Therefore, an alternative location was sought for the electronic sign.

The campus picture below from Google Maps has been modified to show a red rectangle in the middle of our northwest parking lot. This location of the electronic sign would appear to permit a longer viewing time by drivers. Our intent is to place the sign as close to the right-of-way as possible. We believe that this will be the best location.

With a two-sided electronic sign, we can inform drivers from both directions of activities at church, and we will be able to frequently change our messages. The software controlling the sign will be web-based, so the sign can be changed remotely as new activities are planned. Our current sign could be abandoned, left with infrequently changing messages, given to ALBOH, or dismantled. No decision has been made at this point. Status of Funding for Roof Repairs

Since January 2018, we have been raising funds for three major projects which were anticipated to be performed over a number of years. Recently the Board of Trustees have pressed for immediate repair of the Sanctuary roof rather than in two years as originally planned. The accumulated dollars for each project (held in separate reserve funds) is listed below as of 17 Sept 2018:

Sanctuary Roof Reserve = \$18,572.09 Air Conditioner Reserve = \$19,946.00 Insurance Deductible Reserve = \$6,470.15

The Board of Trustees have accepted a contract for sanctuary roof repairs in the amount of slightly under \$28,000. With the amount currently in the Sanctuary Roof Reserve account, we are approximately \$9,500 short. The roof work should be completed by the end of November. Therefore, we have two months remaining before this bill becomes due. **We ask that you consider how you might further support paying off this obligation.** Thank you.


