From the Pastor's Desk

The world today is full of outright lies, half-truths, twisted information and fake news. Unfortunately these have made their way into the main-stream media and it has become very difficult for the average person to obtain the unbiased truth. How many times have you heard or read about an event, made a judgement according to the information you had, and then learned the rest of the story . . . and when you heard the rest of the story, everything changed? Where can we go to get, as Joe Friday would say, "The facts, just give me the facts, sir."

Guess what? That scenario is played out in the church and religion every day. We are told things about God, the Bible and how we should act, perhaps by someone we truly trust, that are not true. We are told things that are not supported by the Word of God. It is vitally important for the Christian to know the truth that is contained in God's Word. To do this the Christian must be in the Scriptures on a regular basis. The Christian should check out the preacher's or teacher's interpretations with the Scripture – not just take it for the truth until you confirm it.

Looking back, she was utterly amazed at how God had worked in her and our family in certain situations and marveled at the "amazing grace" God has and is pouring out on us. Looking back, things had a new perspective and she could see how God had worked miracles in our lives.

You may think you cannot understand Scripture, but if you read it, think on it, and allow the Spirt time to work, like Penny's journals, one day you will look back and see how far God has led you and the importance of the Scriptures in your life. May God illuminate His Word as you read it and apply it in your life.

"Rick Nelson opened for Breakfast today, offering our guests a variety of cereals, and Danish pastry and other pastries and donuts. The drink options were fresh hot coffee, cold milk, fruit juice and bottled water.

"At Lunchtime, Rick McLellan led our guests in prayer. Debbie gave the devotion from Psalm 91, OUR SAFE PLACE. Then, Debbie and Rick served 28 guests beans and rice, green beans and fresh baked corn muffins. To quench thirst was coffee, iced tea, milk and bottled water. We also had about a dozen take-out plates.

"The ice machine worked well all day, and the shower, washers and dryers were busy. We issued a number of clothing, toiletry and pantry items, and thanks to a wonderful Methodist friend, we gave out socks as well.

"Even though we were given a number of pop-top cans to give out, we gave them all out and all that were in the pantry. We are, however, having more summer-month guests than we usually expect.

"It was a busy day and we were praying about the bareness of the pantry near the end of the day and a lady stopped in and gave us a donation of \$100 to buy food for the bare pantry. She said she was donating in memory of Binh Cao Nguyen who went to be with the Lord July 9, 2018. Please join our hearts in prayer for peace and blessings for his family.
