The Greek word for the church is *ekklesia*. It is the assembly of people called out by God. One Saturday last month Penny and I returned to Hardee County for a funeral. Most of you are aware that I am from Hardee County and before coming to Lake Gibson served First UMC Bowling Green for 6 years. That church had been founded in 1880.

The lady we were honoring had been a life-long member of that church. She had taught Sunday School for over 50 years and was a pillar of the church and the community. That church had been a vital part of Hardee County and Bowling Green for years. In 1948 they sent 100 children to the Leesburg Camp for kids – 100 from that one church. The cemetery is directly behind the church – it was once owned by the church but the city owns and operates it now.

When Hurricane Irma came through that part of Florida all three of the church buildings suffered roof damage. The church could not afford to meet the required insurance deductible for repair, so it ended up closing. It was later sold by the Conference to a private individual who is using it for business.

As I stood in the cemetery and looked back at the building I was shocked. Windows had been broken and were boarded up by a disarray of lumber. Doors were barricaded and things piled around the back of the sanctuary, wires were hanging out of air conditioners. I literally had tears running down my face thinking of how sad it is for this church to be in this condition.

I was too caught up in the emotion at that moment to hear God, but since then He has been gently nudging me. Many, if not all, the folks that had been members of the church when this lady was active were at that graveside service. Memories were shared, people rejoiced with one another and offered prayers and well wishes for the family. Ministry occurred there in that cemetery.

Since that day God has spoken to me to say "See Steve, the church is still there; not in that building, but in the hearts of the people. The church thrives in the community among people, not in a building made of cement and mortar. It cannot be closed by anything or anyone."

Yes, God - message received.

Should you desire a more in-depth reading, consider going to the bottom of any page on our website, find the left-hand column entitled WORSHIP WITH US, and click the last hyperlink, Daily Bible Reading. Here you will find multiple readings which change daily. You can read them or click the triangle to hear the text read aloud.

Do You Drive?

Think of all the places you like to go. It's great therapy to get out and join others in activities, but not everyone can still drive. Some people are limited from driving at night, while others have given up their licenses forever.

Lake Gibson UMC supports numerous activities which are held off-campus. The Mix and Mingle (M&Ms) Senior Activities Group schedules interesting excursions, some recreational and some religious in nature. The Gulf Central District, of which we are a part, offers training sessions periodically outside of Central Florida. Other activities such as the recently completed CROP Hunger Walk and March 21st's Wonder Walk occur in Lakeland.

The upcoming Day on Campus at the Florida United Methodist Children's Home (FUMCH) requires a drive of about 75 minutes on a good day.

The point is, a lot of Lake Gibson people would participate in off-campus activities if transportation were provided. If you still drive, you can help. Please consider registering to drive the church van. If we had a roster of qualified drivers they could "share the load" so one person isn't on the hook for every trip.

Driving a 12-passenger van is not difficult. A short spin around the neighborhood and you'll get the feel of it.

Call the church office today (863-85805431) to get checked out to drive our van and help those who can't drive.

Good News for Junaid!

Junaid Saqib's request for asylum has been approved! This is the first step toward bringing his wife, who is a nurse, and their two daughters, ages 4 and 8, to America.

Junaid has asked Lake Gibson UMC to help him secure short-term housing for himself in late March, and a suitable house or apartment and furnishings for his family when they arrive. Pastor Steve and church leaders will examine what support we can provide and ask for approval by the Church Council.

Needs include furniture, clothing, etc., and assistance (or mentoring) for his wife to obtain approval to work in the US as a foreign-trained nurse. We will probably need many shepherds to help the family adapt to life in the US.

In the meantime, please pray for the continued safety of Junaid's family in Pakistan, and for help obtaining lodging and other necessities the family will need.

The monthly electronic copy of *The Good News* currently found at https://lakegibsonumc.com/our-newsletters-2020


The "Church Blog" found at www.LakeGibsonUMC.com


The electronic calendar found at https://lakegibsonumc.com/our-calendar/

Which is most up-to-date? Well, as most printed materials are old once they leave the printer, **the most up-to-date version should be found on the church's electronic calendar.** This copy is visible on computers, tablets, and smartphones.

By default, we show the calendar in a monthly format, although you can change it to either Week or Agenda view. The Week view permits you to see the event and the block of time it occupies. **Additionally, if you click an event, additional details will drop down** (if the event sponsor has provided the webmaster, Dwight Kitchens, that information).

The example on the left is in the Month view. It reflects details on the March 28th FUMCH "Open House" (Day on Campus) in Enterprise, FL. The right example presents a chronological list (Agenda view) of events on the calendar. On the right-hand side of the Agenda view you can scroll down through the entire year. Again, merely by clicking on the event, you may see additional details.





Our Administrative Secretary keeps the calendar, and provides those details to the webmaster, newsletter editor, and Facebook manager for dissemination. **This electronic calendar should always have the most detailed, up-to-date information** about events in the church and selected outside events.

As of May 2019 FUMCH had received **\$2,726.45**. Why so little? Possibly those of us who purchase on Amazon.com have yet to designate FUMCH as the recipient of this largesse.

The easiest way to designate FUMCH as your personal charity is to save the following URL in your browser and use it each time you place an order: https://smile.amazon.com/ch/59-0638479.

Easier yet is to tell your browser to open a tab with the same URL each time your browser opens. Since I sometimes use different browsers, I have this saved as a tab in each of them: Microsoft's Edge, Mozilla's Firefox and Google's Chrome. Now, I just have to click the appropriate tab when I want to place an order with Amazon.com, knowing that a small portion (one-half of one percent) will be returned to FUMCH.

Why not join us by becoming a Prayer Warrior? Just check the appropriate box on the "Connection Card" in the Sunday bulletin and place it in the offering plate.



Offering Prayers for Those in Need

You may have noticed that we recently implemented an **online prayer request** on our church website. You will find it on the left-hand side of our front page (www.lakegibsonumc.com).

Under the "Welcome to Our Home" menu, you see both "Submit Your Prayer Request" and "View Prayers Requested".




To make a submission, you must provide your Name, Email address, and Request Type (Prayer). The drop-down for **Category** includes choices of Sunday Prayer Requests, Deliverance, Generational Healing, Inner Healing, Physical Healing, Protection, Relationships, Salvation, and Spiritual Healing.

Type in a title and message (prayer content). Once this is complete, and you are satisfied, click "SUBMIT" and the prayer will be recorded.

Your submitted prayer will be found, along with others, under the "View Prayers Requested" option on the same page. Here you will see your own prayer, and possibly those of other individuals. You may pray for them and click PRAY on the right-hand side. This adds your prayer

You may also make a supportive comment in regard to this particular prayer. This will show your name, when posted, and your comment. Should you desire to "Hide replies", you will not see the posted comments. You may change it back to see replies by clicking "Show replies".

Our intent is to open up our prayers to a wider audience. In doing so, the poster should insure that they only provide information which they feel comfortable in sharing with a wider audience. While this is an extension of our Prayer Ministry, we don't want details which are so personal in nature that the recipient of the prayer would object to it being made public.



If, upon second thought, you desire that a prayer request be removed from a wider audience, send an email to Dwight@DwightKitchens.com requesting that it be deleted. The webmaster has the ability to delete older prayer requests as well as inappropriate submissions.

New Prayer Request Cards

You may have noticed that slightly **revised prayer request cards** have shown up in the holders on the backs of the pews. Why?

We've found a nice program for our church website, www.lakegibsonumc.com, which permits anyone to quickly share a prayer need. The program records prayers, permits comments and counts the number of people who report that they have prayed for that concern.

Ah, but there is a "but". Unless you MARK the box on the prayer card next to the word ONLINE, we won't type your prayer request on our website. So, if you want to expose your prayer concern to a wider audience, mark the box so you inform the church that you want it included on the website.

Of course, people who did not make it to church will still be able to request prayer support when they type their own request online.

This website posting is in addition to the Prayer Journal and email notifications of prayer needs to our Prayer Warriors.

Special Collections

We are entering the season for Special Collections. The United Methodist Church recognizes six "Special Sundays with Collection". The next one is **March 22nd, UMCOR Sunday** which pays the administrative costs of the United Methodist Committee on Relief. Because the overhead is paid, every dollar donated to support a specific relief effort goes to that effort.


These special programs were all in addition to our usual devotion to helping others at Hope House, Lakeland Volunteers in Medicine (LVIM) and in many other areas of our community.

Did You Miss One of This Month's Sermons?

Sometimes you're traveling (or have visitors, or just feel puny) and can't make it to Lake Gibson UMC on Sunday. While the sermon wherever you are attending may have been interesting, it's not the same as one from your HOME. Property and Liability Bill

We've been expecting this for some time. We had earlier been told to expect increases in our Property and Liability bill for 2020. Increases were partially due to hurricane damage and partially due to lawsuits against the United Methodist Church.

Property and Liability Bill Continued

For comparison, in 2018 we paid, after a 2% discount for early payment, \$16,348, while in 2019 our bill came to \$17,717. Our increase in the bill was approximately 8.5%.

For 2020, our bill is **\$22,672** before discount, or \$22,220 after a 2% discount. This is an increase of nearly **26%** for FY 2020, or **\$4,503** over our last bill.

How can we minimize this cost increase in the future? Well, it is unlikely that we can affect the weather. But, as a congregation, we can be extra careful how we operate within the church.

- 1. Insuring that our Child Protection Policies are trained and adhered to by employees and volunteers who interact with children and youth.
- 2. Insuring that we eliminate hazards within our buildings helps, both in structures and during events in which we invite others to participate (examples: rummage sales, concerts, M&Ms activities, etc.).

It is up to us, as a congregation, to do our best to insure that everyone is safe on Lake Gibson's premises.

We briefly reviewed the UMW Reading Program for 2020 and noted several books that might be interesting. She will check if they are available through the Polk County Library Cooperative.

There will be a Rummage Sale Workers Meeting on Monday, March 30th, at 1:00 pm in the FLC to familiarize our volunteers with how the tasks in each area will be allotted and other changes. On the sale days people will be offered the chance to work a specific shift and then they can leave (if they wish).

My hope is that this will help reduce the hundreds of miles we guys and gals walk on Wed and Thurs sorting items from boxes, bins and bags. My aim is to work smarter, **NOT** harder. My mantra has always been organize, organize, organize because I believe preliminary planning is important to the success of any project.

"With that being said, I'd like to share with you an idea I have that I hope will save bunches of energy for everyone involved in this and future sales.

"It is a **list of work areas**, including a **job description for each**. *Don't panic!* I am open to any and all comments and suggestions pertaining to this form. Sometimes change is hard, but PLEASE remember none of these changes is carved in stone. If it doesn't work this way, we will try another way, and keep trying until we get it right for all. Because, **IF** you always **DO** what you've always **DO**ne, **YOU** will always **GO**et what you've always **GO**t.

"I Hope you are open to trying some changes with me. I will continue to work on the form, fine-tuning it until the first part of April.
