Request for Friday Meal Preparers

Jesus said to Peter three times, "Feed my sheep." (John 21, NRSV). Lake Gibson UMC is indeed answering the Lord's direction by providing three opportunities for our homeless brothers and sisters to receive food and other services. Wednesday night and Saturday morning volunteers provide meals at our Family Life Center (FLC). The third opportunity is described below.

Hope House Mobile (HHM) is looking for wonderful volunteers to provide meals for the homeless on Fridays. The donations may be set as a one-time event, occasionally, or once a month.

On Fridays, Geri Mayo serves at the pavilion at Hunt Fountain Park, 7036 Green Rd, Lakeland, FL 33810, from 11:30 am to 12:30-1pm.

Our December schedule as of November 21st is as follows: Dec 2nd -- covered;

Dec 9th -- open; Dec 16th -- open; Dec 23rd -- covered; Dec 30th -- open.

HHM is requesting a Friday meal large enough for 15 servings. The extras to complete the meal would be greatly appreciated. For example: crackers for soup or chili, inexpensive parmesan cheese for pasta or bread with a casserole.

HHM has serving utensils. Also, food is either transferred to Crockpots or a Styrofoam container is used to keep pans warm. The pavilion has stainless steel serving tables, a sink and electrical outlets.

Hot food donations may be dropped off at Lake Gibson United Methodist Church, 424 W Daughtery Road, Lakeland, FL 33809, by 10:45 am on Fridays, or brought to Hunt Fountain Park by 11:30 am.

Volunteers do not need to serve; however, they are welcome to stay and meet the guests.

If Fridays are inconvenient, arrangements may be made to drop off cold prepared dinners earlier in the week.

Please contact Geri Mayo at 863-589-3329 to coordinate your Friday meal donations. (Text messages are best.) She may also be reached at gerijmayo@yahoo.com.

Volunteer cooks, servers and workers are also requested for HHM's meals at LGUMC. In addition to setting up, serving food and cleaning up, workers are needed to handle the "clothes closet" and take care of towels, etc. for showers. At present, we have only three people doing all of this service. We need to step up the level of church support for this essential mission to the homeless.

- 1. Meals and/or side dishes would be welcome. Wednesday nights we need food for 20-25 servings. Please contact Geri to help out.


