### **Easter Egg Hunt**

The United Methodist Men of Lake Gibson UMC will hold an easter egg hunt on Saturday, 1 April 2023. Mark your calendar now! It is designed for children through age twelve. We will have two search areas, one within the ALBOH fencing and one in the rest of the property. There will be eggs, games, food and prizes as well.

In addition to church families, we are inviting children from Cub Pack 711 and the four elementary schools served by ALBOH for after school programs. We envision this to be our largest participation ever.

Once again, we ask for support in the purchasing of non-meltable candies. Candies will be placed within plastic eggs. Miniatures which are prepackaged are probably best.

### 'TIS THE SEASON FOR CHOIR ROBES

LGUMC Choir members began wearing choir robes during December after a long hiatus of singing in more casual clothing. Do robes contribute to better singing? Do they provide dignity and solemnity to Worship? Do they erase the individual identity of singers? Are they uncomfortable, resulting in stressful singing? Do they unify an unspoken dress code to prevent occasional gauche attire? Our Choir sings with true voices from true hearts. This month they don robes for sacred respect toward the Church's Advent Season. They hope the robes are an enjoyable, unifying experience to connect Choir and Congregation to worship God together in music!

The Administrative Council of Lake Gibson UMC would like to report the results of the vote on disaffiliation.

There were 115 total votes, both members and non-members, 80 for disaffiliation and 35 for remaining within the UMC.

Of 91 members of LGUMC, 66 were in favor of disaffiliation and 25 opposed.

Percentage wise, of members, 72.5% were in favor of disaffiliation, while 27.5% were opposed.

Based on these figures, Church Council will continue to pursue disaffiliation.

Please realize that in the near term, this is unlikely to change anything regarding how we worship each week.

As the year comes to an end; we are pleased to announce that Merry Matters has been able to provide over 31 sleeping mats to both Hope House and Talbot House Ministries for the homeless in the Lakeland area. On Christmas Eve he played beautiful carols which were warmed the heart if not our fingers!

The following people went the extra mile to support this year's Red Kettle campaign and are recognized for their special devotion: Barb Allen-Coil (10 hours over 3 days), Cathy D'Amato (4 hours/2 days), Bev and Eric Hines (4 hours/2 days), Cyndi Kuhlman (6 hours/3 days); Debbie Moore and Bev Ellis (4 hours/2 days); Betty Seabo (6 hours/3 days) and Phyllis and Dwight Kitchens (10 hours/4 days).

Due to the extreme cold (35 degrees on Saturday morning), the Salvation Army ended this Red Kettle campaign 2 hours early. So far funds raised at our Publix have been reported for only 4 of the 25 days of this campaign: \$1,714.25. The money reported is the sum for all organizations that volunteered at our Publix each day, and are not broken down by the ringer's organization.

Supporting the Salvation Army is one way we live out our vision To be a joyful church family that is crucial to our community. In both 2018 (with 33 ringers) and 2019 (34 ringers), Lake Gibson rang for 72 hours. The 2018 total raised by all organizations at the Plantation Square Publix was \$2,100. In 2019 the total was just under \$4,300.

### **Financial Challenges for 2023**

Not withstanding discussions about our affiliation with the United Methodist Church, Lake Gibson United Methodist Church faces some financial challenges.

- 1. As our congregation ages, more people are moving to be closer to their families. Others are concerned about the possibility that we might disaffiliate and have gone elsewhere. Each results in a loss of contributions which impacts those of us remaining.
- 2. For at least three years we have been asking for volunteers to help with our worship services. Primarily, our audio/video team currently requires at least three people on Sunday and one during both choir and praise team rehearsals. As current volunteers need backfill, our only solution is to attempt to hire employees. We have hired an individual to run our sound mixer. Adding a paid part-time "Audio/Video Technician" to our staff might run up to \$4,200 per year. If we found a second person for our VMix video operation, this hire could bring this total to \$8,400 per year.
- 3. This past summer we added an "Assistant Worship Leader" to our payroll. This college student costs approximately \$12,750 per year.
- 4. Recently we added help to run the slides for our services. This high school student does get minimally paid to the tune of approximately \$1,475 per year.
- 5. For approximately four years we have been discussing getting a Youth Pastor to rebuild a program at LGUMC.
- 6. Unfortunately, until recently, we have not been able to locate interested individuals. Pastor Anthony has now found an interested individual for a full-time position. There may be sufficient funds in our former Children/Youth endowment (currently a designated fund) to pay for a portion of a year's salary. The balance will have to be included in our general budget. Until an offer is made it is unknown what this might add to our budget. With possible salary, housing, insurance, and retirement contribution, it may be significant.
- 7. While inflation has hit all of us, please realize that it also affects your church. Our expenses are growing as well. We will shortly modify our budget forecast to include the above anticipated additional costs.

I'm asking that as we have ended FY 2022, you prayerfully consider how you can support our church by your prayer, presence, and financial contributions. While inflation has risen, many of us have received Cost of Living Adjustments this year. Consider how you might financially enhance your support of our church in 2023!
