 From the Pastor's Desk

Bishop Ken Carter wrote a recent article in Duke University's e-magazine that got me to thinking. When society looks at the church they often see a tightly controlled, judgmental, hypocritical, diminishing, closed club where everyone looks and believes alike. While we must admit that many of these perceptions have merit we also acknowledge that is not what Jesus had in mind for His Body. So then: What does the church have going for it? What makes it different than the Elks or the Moose or the Kiwanis or any other civic minded club?

First we have the person of Jesus Christ. The church is built upon and rests on Jesus Christ the Son of God who became flesh, lived a perfect life, died an atoning death, was resurrected bodily and spiritually and now reigns at the right hand of his Father God and will come again one day to claim his Bride. While other organizations may be founded upon the principals of one man only Christianity has a God that died for mankind and rose again; only the church shows the word an empty grave to prove it has a living God.

Secondly we have the Holy Scriptures – The Bible; other clubs have their own books and writing but Christianity claims that the writings are sacred and come straight from the mouth of the one worshipped. We teach that these writings contain the information we need to order our lives in a meaningful and worshipful manner and that if we truly obey them we will be content.

Thirdly we have a sacred meal; we call it Communion, The Eucharist or The Lord's Supper. Our Lord instructed us to observe this rite and to celebrate the giving of His life for the remission of sin when we partake of it. Much more is also packed into this meal with the Holy Spirit's presence so that the meal itself can comfort, restore, convict and bring peace to those who partake of it.

Lastly we have a fellowship of believers, the Church, who confess to put their trust in the three things above and live together in a brotherly love. We often fight over how the 3 things above work, how we are to live them out and what they mean and we often refuse to live together and/or accept other people's views about those things. Yet, the Church is what Christ has chosen to work in and through to reach a lost and hurting word, the Church is the organization he told the disciples to found and keep alive, the Church is the body that is to help those less fortunate and spread the Gospel around the world.

Perhaps we should rethink our commitment to the Church and remember it is not something to be taken lightly or flippantly nor is it to be ignored or forsaken. Our membership in it is a solemn spiritual matter that is truly a life or death matter. According to Jesus there is no such thing as lone Christians. Christians are to be in fellowship with one another.
