From the Pastor's Desk

I am learning a lot about the expense and time involved in the upkeep of a pool. While it is a pleasure to jump in the cooling water on hot summer days (especially after mowing the yard), calming to sit in the shade and hear the ripple of the water and to enjoy the laughter of grandchildren playing in the pool; it takes time and attention to keep the water clear and safe to swim in. The filter must be cleaned each week and replaced at regular intervals, the water must be tested regularly, whether it looks fine or not, chlorine and chemicals added as needed. the bottom and sides of the pool have to be scrubbed and vacuumed to keep the algae and dirt out of the water and still there are times when special steps must be taken to keep the water clean and safe (like when a mustard bloom occurs). In the winter care must be taken so the lines do not freeze and many people allow their pool to go dormant during the winter to save on expenses yet this means at the beginning of summer they must work hard to prepare it for use. Penny and I choose to keep the pool up even though we will not swim it in the winter we enjoy looking at it.

This is all a lot like our relationship with the Lord. We must also diligently tend to it on a regular basis and take certain steps to keep that relationship in the proper perspective.

This would include Bible reading, prayer, meditation, regular attendance in a fellowship group and other things. We would also have special times when we may need to participate in intense Bible studies or attend special conferences and training events to stay close to the Lord. Yet, I am afraid most of us only pay attention to the upkeep necessary with God when we need Him. We want the presence of God when we are in tight spots but ignore Him when things are going well.

It has been my observation that most people just take their relationship with God for granted until they need Him. Labor Day is a symbol of our nation returning to the seriousness of school and work. It is used to refocus our attention to the task at hand and call us from the lazy days of summer vacations. Perhaps if God's people would also refocus on their relationship with him, being attentive to stay close to Him and continuing to learn of His ways, never allowing this relationship to go dormant, taking whatever steps is necessary to stay in God's perfect graces; our lives would more accurately reflect God to our neighbors and give us a more perfect peace in the midst of the storms of our world.






