Financial:

If you look closely, you will note that our current budget forecast has increased. This is primarily due to small changes in the manner in which we have computed payroll. Additionally, we now have increased our employees since September with an Assistant Worship Leader, an Audio Technician, and a Sound Booth Assistant. We have yet to hire a youth director which will increase our expenses once again. I anticipate that this will be decided within the next month. While January has consistently looked good, it is partially due to our receiving one member's entire year's tithe in January. This significantly skews the data. Additionally, the church attempted to acquire a second used van for ALBOH. While ALBOH was paying for the van, it would be owned and insured by the church. This required that \$10,000 of ALBOH's reserves be transferred to LGUMCH in January. Unfortunately, the conference informed us that they would not insure this 15 passenger van. In February we returned the \$10,000 to ALBOH. So, January was overstated by \$10,000 and February was reduced by \$10,000.

If we adjust for these issues, we are receiving less now than we did in FY 2020 while our expenses are higher. Our anticipated shortfall is approximately \$43,000 for FY 2023.

We often have individuals contributing to restricted accounts (which we don't spend on other items without their permission). These are often items which make us "feel good" as they are items in which we have a particular interest. Examples would include the food pantry, Jerusalem Fund, Insurance Deductible Reserve, Air Conditioner Reserve, Hope House, Sound Booth Renovation, Roof Reserve, Parking Lot Paving, etc.

What I would like to propose is that we should give to our general budget first and to designate accounts second. Better yet, we should consider whether we can afford to tithe to the church's general budget. If we each did this, I believe there would be sufficient funds to operate the church's primary mission. After this, it is time to prioritize our designated needs and raise funds. The Conference has often thought that every church should get rid of their designated accounts as they are not easily fungible (changeable based on new situations). If we had excess funds within our General Budget it would be easy to move funds around to meet new requirements. But, we need to insure that we can meet our budget before we continue to put funds toward designated purposes. Only by your support can we actually meet our budget obligations.
