There are lots of things going on here at Lake Gibson! We are hard at work trying to find activities that will attract new members and young families to our church. We want them to find a place they can call home and grow in their relationship with Jesus Christ.

Well, just like when you have company come to your house for a visit, you need to tidy up a bit. We have received approval to finally pave our driveway and parking lot in front of the Sanctuary and FLC. We can finally get rid of all that dust and muddy puddles.

We are also making some changes to the use of our facilities. We have hired a Director of Children/Youth Ministries, Justin Bennett. With that exciting new hire, we need to provide him with a place to live. So, we are converting the Church office back into a Parsonage. This Parsonage will also continue to be used for our very important Food Pantry. We will be moving the Church Office into the overflow areas of the Sanctuary. One very exciting aspect of this move will be that everyone will now have access to the Sanctuary throughout the week during regular office hours for prayer, meditation, etc.

There have been a couple of concerns that have been expressed to me regarding moving the office into the Sanctuary that I would like to address. First, if we take the seating in the overflow areas for office use, where will people sit? Well rest assured we have considered that. The overflow areas being converted into office space currently provides seating for 45 people. We can add two more rows of chairs in the front of the Sanctuary that will make up those 45 seats. So, you better get to church early if you don't want to sit up front. Also, if we are so blessed that we run out of seats, we can go to two services. I know many of you miss an early service.

The second concern that has been expressed to me regarding these improvements is, "How are we paying for this?" Well, all of these improvements are being paid for utilizing donations made by individuals specifically for these purposes. Therefore, we are not compromising our General Budget funds for any of these improvements.

Along with these changes to our facilities, the Body of Christ has been incredibly busy with activities. Those of you that currently participate in the many different ministries and committees know exactly what I am talking about. The Trustees, Finance, Staff-Parrish, Church Council, Visitations, Prayer Warriors, UWF, Food Pantry, Hope House, Outreach Ministries, Nurturing Ministries, Worship/Welfare Ministries, Music, Missions and so many more. We are blessed with hard working volunteers that love the Lord and live to serve Him. If you are not aware of this bee hive of activity going on in your church, then you need to ask someone how you too can get involved.

Financial:

Financial Information thru January 2023

Last year our budget was set at \$295,275. This year we start with an increase of \$8,848. This change is before we finalize the hiring of a full-time youth director. Additionally, the Church Council will likely look into other one-time expenses which we may need to incur during FY2023. Some will likely be required should Lake Gibson United Methodist Church pursue disaffiliation from the denomination. Additionally, there are other actions under discussion which were not envisioned in October 2022 when the budget was initially drafted. Should these additional actions be approved, they will likely be prioritized by the Church Council for implementation.

When looking at the months of January in 2021, 2022 and 2023, it appears that we start the year off well. Later months take a significant drop in contributions. This is partially due to receiving at least one yearly tithe during the first month of the year.

LGUMC has a number of reserved funds which are not found within our yearly operational budget. Contributions have been made to these "designated accounts" for a specific purpose. We also have reserved funds which came from our former endowment accounts. Examples are that we have \$17,096 in our Youth Operation Account from 2017 and \$65,558 from our former Youth/Child endowment. Once these funds are expended, our budget would need to be increased to continue these programs.

I encourage you to look now at how you support the continued operation of our church. If you do not tithe, consider that the church, like individuals, incurs increasing costs to keep our doors open. This past year, many of us received an eight point seven percent increase in Social Security payments. Hopefully, you found it in your heart to share this in helping to continue the mission of our church.
