Financial Update

Well, our financial records from the end of May are now available for publication. The first chart reflects that we are below where we would have anticipated we would be at this point in the year (\$149,993 anticipated average vs \$122,961 actual). The second chart reflects that we are 21.83% behind where we had anticipated.

Thanks to Pastor Rob, we should make up some of this shortage during the second half of the year. But, as you may have seen from congregational attendance, our numbers appear to be dwindling. We, collectively, need to address changes in programs to entice additional attendees. The Church Council desires to build a family which can bring members of our communities into our fold. Your thoughts on how we might succeed in this endeavor are always welcome.

Thanks to all who have been supporting the Florida United Methodist Children's Home (FUMCH) bicycle repair program. On the 31st of May we delivered a dozen repaired bicycles to the facility. We also checked out a pile of broken bicycles which might be repairable. After putting nine in the church's trailer to bring home, we found that five of the dozen just delivered had already been picked up by a group of children who were seen riding around the campus. Of the nine brought home, seven were actually repairable and have now been fixed and are ready for the return trip to FUMCH.
