

Mission Effectiveness

Previously, our Book of Discipline outlined the number of boards and committees we were expected to establish each year. This required your leadership to participate in at least two if not more scheduled meetings each month. Meetings are not ministry! Let's focus on ministry while making meetings fewer in number but larger in meaning.

Kay Kotan and Blake Bradford suggested a solution in the book MISSION:POSSIBLE, a simple structure for Missional Effectiveness. Their book is aimed at congregational leaders, particularly Methodists. The authors provide practical, field-tested steps to simplify our church structure and unleash more people into ministry. Too often churches try to simplify their structures by just having fewer people at the meeting table. But real simplification and accountable leadership means that meetings – and leaders – are transformed.

Are we coordinated?

Are we about to discuss our clothing choices? No, another subject entirely. We're constantly attempting to insure that you have ready access to what is happening in the church. There are five primary means through which we do this:

Our monthly copy of "The Good News" found in hard copy within the Narthex

Which is most up-to-date? Well, as most printed materials are old once they leave the printer, **the most up-to-date version should be found within the church's electronic calendar.** This copy is visible on computers, tablets, and smartphones. By default, we show the calendar in a monthly format, although you can change it to either a Week or Agenda view. The Week view permits you to see the event and the block of time it occupies. Additionally, if you click an **event, it should give you additional details on that event.** The first example is in the Month view which reflects details on the 28 March's FUMCH "Open House" in Enterprise, FL. The second example reflects a chronological list of events within the calendar. On the right-hand side of the Agenda view you can scroll down through the entire year. Again, merely by clicking on the event, you may see additional details (if they are known).

They are senior citizens without family, no one to be with at Christmas and are barely getting by. The list this year must bring a tear to your eye. It ranges from a microwave oven (including microwave meals) to a bag of dog food for their medium size pet. The most sought after gift was new tennis shoes, the most unusual was light bulbs and AA batteries. Think about this, folks. Would any of these items make the top of your wish list? A kitchen garbage can with bags? a coloring book and crayons? Probably not. I am so happy and so very proud to say our members stepped up, fulfilled all the wishes for the 25 names on our list and in addition donated an extra 300.00. I took three car loads of beautifully wrapped gifts, each with a hand made greeting card, to the designated drop off place to be picked up by the case workers and then distributed to each individual. 

As you know, we paid an exit obligation to depart the United Methodist denomination. This is reflected in our November financials as we paid the remaining \$75,182 to the Florida Conference. We obtained these funds by cashing in securities owned by Lake Gibson UMC (\$64,987.76) and pulling undesignated funds (\$37,333) from the United Methodist Foundation. In total, we had more than was required with the balance remaining in our checking account.

There remain numerous conversion items which we must fund. These include removing the cross and flame logo found within the sanctuary, as well as on signage, choir robe stoles, our electronic sign, aprons, etc. These costs will primarily be absorbed by the surplus of funds set aside for disaffiliation.

Effectively, this means that our income was overstated in November by the \$64,987.76 which was withdrawn from our Edward Jones Investment account. I have adjusted the two charts to reflect that this was actually not income but rather a transfer from the Edward Jones Investment account to the remaining disaffiliation cost. Therefore, our financial records and these charts differ by the \$64,987.76.

At the end of November 2023 we had effectively spent \$8,064 dollars more than we had brought in. Hopefully, we have been good stewards within our ministries. Based on the pledges accepted during November, we are looking to modify our budget projections to insure that we don't have financial difficulties in 2024. By the time you read this analysis, we will have had actual December 2023 data available. It is unlikely that we will have reached
