Financial Update for February

Yes, we are still solvent. No, we did not raise the funds we originally thought we would require. Thankfully, Pastor Rob, as a retired pastor, saved us significant funds over his six month tenure in salary (\$11,000), housing allowance (\$11,000), retirement contribution (\$4,200), and health payments (\$7,704), for a total of \$33,904saved. Again, we "Thank" Pastor Rob for his unselfishness toward Lake Gibson Methodist Church.

For 2024, we see a different picture. We will hopefully have a new pastor by the time you read this in February. We will again require significant funds to be expended for pastoral care. This is our largest budget item.

Our apportionments last year were approximately \$23,000. Under the GMC, these will drop to \$6,103. This will be a savings of \$16,8967. In contrast, last year our Property and Liability Insurance policy cost us \$25,619 under the conference while this year our independent policy will cost \$26,131 without named storm coverage (hurricanes). This is the reason we continue to have a Insurance Reserve Fund to help support repairs required by storm damage.

As seen above, we were raised significantly less than we desired. In order to maintain programs, it is unlikely that we can withstand at \$67,245 loss next year. Now that we have the year-end figures for 2023, we will have a new budget developed for 2024. I anticipate that the total will be less than that of 2023, but not by a significant amount.

Financial status of A Little Bit of Heaven (ALBOH)

I have heard that some of our church members are concerned about A Little Bit of Heaven Child Enrichment Center financial relationship with our church. Starting in 2015 we have been self sufficient. We pay our share of electricity, water. phone, refuse, taxes, etc.. plus giving the church \$500 monthly (like rent). We even have our own copier. We pay 100% of our payroll. The staff clean our facility, thus no custodian fees. We paid 100% on a new roof and playground plus paid for repair bills when indicated. We paid for new floors, two new bathrooms, new front door and security system.

These past two years we were awarded several large financial grants to improve our educational material, and provide bonuses for our staff. We have a small private program for the after school children that we give 10% of our proceeds to the church.

We do some fund raisers that are mainly supported by our parents but open to all who wish to participate.

I hope I have answered your concerns. Please see me after church if you have any other questions.


The Sox Drive in December was again a big success. 224 pair of socks faithful.
